<p>Power pop (also typeset as powerpop) is a subgenre of rock music and a form of pop rock[2] based on 📉 the early music of bands such as the Who , the Beatles, the Beach Boys, and the Byrds.[3][4] It typically incorporates &# 128201; melodic hooks, vocal harmonies, an energetic performance, and cheerful sounding music underpinned by a sense of yearning, longing, despair, or 📉 ; self-empowerment. The sound is primarily rooted in pop and rock traditions of the early to mid-1960s, although some artists have 📉 occasionally draw n from later styles such as punk, new wave, glam rock, pub rock, college rock, a nd neo-psychedelia.</p> <p>Originating in the 📉 1960s, power pop developed mainly among A merican musicians who came of age during the British Invasion. Many of these you ng 📉 musicians wished to retain the "teenage innocence" of po p and rebelled against newer forms of rock music that were thought 📉 to be pretentious and inaccessible. The term was coined in 1967 by the Who guitari st and songwriter Pete Townshend to 📉 describe his band's style of music. However, power pop became more widely identified with later acts of the 1 970s who 📉 sought to revive Beatles-style pop.</p> <p>Early 1970s releases by Badfinger, the Raspberries, and Todd Rundgren a re sometimes credited with solidifying the 📉 power pop sound into a rec ognizable genre. Power pop reached its commercial peak during the rise of punk a nd new 📉 wave in the late 1970s, with Cheap Trick, the Knack, the Roman tics, Nick Lowe, Dave Edmunds, and Dwight Twilley among 📉 those enjoyin g the most success. After a popular and critical backlash to the genre's big gest hit, "My Sharona" (The Knack, 📉 1979), record companies generally stopped signing power pop groups, and most of the 1970s bands broke up in the early 📉 1980s.</p> <p>Over subsequent decades, power pop continued with modest commercial suc cess while also remaining a frequent object of derision among some 📉 cr itics and musicians. The 1990s saw a new wave of alternative bands that were dra wn to 1960s artists because of 📉 the 1980s music they had influenced. A Ithough not as successful as their predecessors, Jellyfish, the Posies, Redd Kro ss, Teenage Fanclub, 📉 and Material Issue were critical and cult favori tes.
