<p>Carlo Ancelotti , (born 10 June 1959) is an Italian professional footba
ll manager and former player who is the manager1 , £ of Real Madrid. Nicknamed &qu
ot;Don Carlo",[4] he is regarded as one of the greatest managers of all tim
e.[5][6][7] Ancelotti is1 , £ the most decorated manager in UEFA Champions League
history, having won the trophy a record four times as coach (twice1 , £ with AC Mi) Tj T*

ed teams1 , £ in five Champions League finals.[8] As a player, he won the European
Cup twice with AC Milan in 1989 and1 , £ 1990, making him one of seven people to
have won the European Cup or Champions League as both a player1 , £ and a manager.

Ancelotti is also the first and only manager ever to have won league titles in
all of1 , £ Europe's top five leagues.[9] He has won the FIFA Club World Cup t
hree times, and is also the manager with1 , £ the joint-most UEFA Super Cup triumph
hs, having won the trophy on four occasions, managing Milan and Real Madrid.[10]

<p>Ancelotti played as1 , £ a midfielder and began his career with Italian c
lub Parma, helping the club to Serie B promotion in 1979. He1 , £ moved to Roma th
e following season, where he won a Serie A title and four Coppa Italia titles, a
nd also1 , £ played for the late 1980s Milan team, with which he won two league ti
tles and two European Cups, among other1 , £ titles. At international level he pla
yed for the Italy national team on 26 occasions, scoring once, and appeared in t
wo1 , £ FIFA World Cups, finishing in third place in the 1990 edition of the tourn
ament, as well as UEFA Euro 1988,1 , £ where he helped his nation to reach the sem
i-finals.</p>

<p>As a manager, Ancelotti worked for Reggiana, Parma and Juventus between
19951 , £ and 2001, before rising to prominence with Milan. Appointed as manager
in 2001, he went onto win both the 2002–031 , £ Champions League and 2002–03 Cop
Italia. The following season, he won the Scudetto with an Italian record of 82
points1 , £ from 34 games, and three years later he won his second Champions Leagu
e with Milan. During his tenure with Milan,1 , £ Ancelotti was awarded the Serie A
Coach of the Year twice. He announced his resignation from Milan after the 2008
–091 , £ season, leaving as Milan's longest-serving manager in a single spell.

ouble of the Premier League and FA Cup in his first season. In 2011, he became t
he manager of French1 , £ club Paris Saint-Germain; the following season he won th
em their first Ligue 1 title in 19 years and was awarded1 , £ joint Ligue 1 Manage
r of the Year. Following his success in France, Ancelotti was appointed manager
