veloped by Treyarch and published #234; #234; by Activision. It was released for Microsof-
t Windows, PlayStation 3, and Xbox 360 on November 12, 2012, and for the #234; #234; Wii
U on November 18 in North America and November 30 in PAL regions.[1][2][3][4][5]
Black Ops II is the ninth #234; #234; game in the Call of Duty franchise of video games,
a sequel to the 2010 game Call of Duty: Black #234; #234; Ops and the first Call of Duty
game for the Wii U. A corresponding game for the PlayStation Vita, Call #234; #234; of D-
uty: Black Ops: Declassified, was developed by nStigate Games and also released
